Welcome

Paul

Good afternoon. My name is Paul Mott and I am an Authorized Civil Marriage Celebrant. On behalf of *(Names of Bride & Groom)*, I welcome this gathering of family and friends to share in their very special day.

Ring Warming Ceremony *(as an example of something that can be included)*

Paul During this ceremony *(Names of Bride & Groom)* will exchange rings as a symbol of the affectionate unity of their two lives that will be joined into one in understanding, compassion, love and peace in the sanctuary of their marriage and as visible signs of their commitment to one another.

As this ceremony proceeds we ask that everyone take part in the warming of the rings. We ask that you, their family and friends silently wish them health and happiness in lives. The rings will be passed around as we continue and *(Names of Bride & Groom)* ask that you hold them for a moment, warm them with your love, voice a silent wish or blessing for them in their marriage and their future together, then pass the rings on to the next person.

When these rings come back to *(say) Best Man or Maid of Honor* they will contain, in their precious metal, that which is more precious, that which is priceless: your love and hope and pledge of support for this marriage.

First Reading (*Example*)

Paul I now invite (*Name & relationship to Bride & Groom*) to come forward to share a reading on marriage in Kahlil Gibran's 'The Prophet'

You were born together, and together you shall be for evermore.
You shall be together when the white wings of death scatter your days.
You shall be together even in the silent memory of God.
But let there be spaces in your togetherness.
And let the winds of the heavens dance between you.

Love one another, but make not a bond of love:
Let it rather be a moving sea between the shores of your soul.
Fill each other's cup but drink not from one cup.
Give one another of your bread but eat not from the same loaf.
Sing and dance together and be joyous, but let each one of you be alone,
Even as the strings of a lute are alone though they quiver with the same music.

Give your hearts, but not into each other's keeping.
For only the hand of Life can contain your hearts.
And stand together yet not too near together:
For the pillars of the temple stand apart,
And the oak tree and the cypress grow not in each other's shadow.

Second Reading

Paul I now invite (*Name & relationship to Bride & Groom*) to come forward to speak to us of love from Corinthians

Monitum

Paul As an Authorized Civil Marriage Celebrant, I am duly authorized by law to solemnize marriages, according to the law.

Before you (**Bride**), and you (**Groom**) are joined in marriage in my presence and in the presence of these witnesses, I am to remind you of the solemn and binding nature of the relationship into which you are now about to enter.

Marriage, according to law in Australia, is the union of a man and a woman to the exclusion of all others, and is voluntarily entered into for life.

These are the words that announce that through the **Asking** by (**Names of Bride & Groom**) the **Vows** they exchange, the **Exchanging of Rings** and the **Signing of their Marriage Certificates** that (**Names of Bride & Groom**) will be married.
